LOOKING BACK:

It was a busy and enjoyable summer for ZAPANJ members. In July, about 40 children and adults spent a fun weekend at Camp Inawendiwin, in the woods of Burlington County, New Jersey. Later that month, ZAPANJ members met for their annual picnic at Marsh Creek State Park, in Pennsylvania, and then were hosted for tea and snacks at the home of Persis and Adi Kasad, whose kind hospitality has become a cherished annual tradition. Then, on Aug. 20, members packed the Rose Garden, in Hamilton, N.J., for the Navroze and Pateti Function. The cultural enrichment and religion classes began for a new year in September with a floral and prayerful remembrance tribute to honor departed members as well as departed loved ones of members. The special event was conceived and organized by Khorshed Vakil-Unwala in hopes of making it a permanent annual feature of our life as a community.

In October, we met again, for our annual Gahambar function. The venue was new – the Lions Lake Banquet Facility, in Voorhees – but credit for making the function possible went as usual to Behroze and Jahan Kasad, who have been generous financial sponsors of the annual event, and to a small army of volunteers who cooked the delicious food. A children’s Halloween costume contest was conducted at the event, as was a blood marrow-donor match drive. The Gahambar was attended by two fellow Zarathushtis who have directly benefited from bone-marrow transplant therapy.

In November, we boarded a bus to visit the New York Darbe Meher, where ZAPANJ members mingled with members of the Zoroastrian Association of Greater New York, where they renewed friendships or struck up new ones, ate together and prayed together. The group heard a moving rendition of the Atash Niyesh led by Ervad Noshir Karanjia of ZAPANJ and Ervad Pervez Patel of ZAGNY. The two-hour bus ride each way itself helped foster an even greater sense of community and camaraderie among members, with even the driver herself contributing some unexpected hilarity!
